### January 24 meeting - Marilyn Light

Marilyn Light, a Canadian orchid expert, has both a Bachelor of Science (Agriculture) and a Master of Science (Microbiology). From Quebec, Marilyn moved to Barbados where she taught Botany and Biology at the Barbados Community College. She began growing and studying orchids in Barbados in 1970.

Marilyn is the author of a number of books on orchid growing in North America and in the Caribbean and a contributor to many important horticultural journals. She has served in a number of prestigious organizations: President and Conservation Chair of the Canadian Orchid Congress, a member of the IUCN/SSC Orchid Specialist Group, past President of the Ottawa Orchid Society. She is a member of the American Orchid Society, the Royal Horticultural Society, England, and of the Ottawa Horticultural Society where she served as a Director for several years.

At the January meeting, we will be the lucky recipients of this expertise as Marilyn speaks on the culture of Chinese Cymbidiums.

**February 11<sup>th</sup>** from 1:00 p.m. onward, *Winter Greenhouse Knowledge*Henk Oudt has agreed to hold an information exchange at his house on this date to answer questions about greenhouses. More information will be circulated about this event by group email.

Soft plastic containers minimize the damage done to roots in repotting as the soft container can simply be cut off.


