## President's Message

Welcome back to another session of the society. It's been a while since our last general meeting. So far we have had a pretty mild winter, especially compared to the harsh conditions currently being experienced in other parts of North America. At this time of the year, when a pervading bleakness takes over, we can't help but develop a special

appreciate for the beautiful blooms in our greenhouses, on our windowsills and under our light set-ups.

One of my favourite orchids, *Cattleya percivaliana* 'Summit', always seems to bloom right at Christmas. 'Summit' is awarded, deservedly, with an FCC, and never fails to brighten the gloom with cascades of gorgeous pink and mauve flowers on a big healthy plant (As a single caution, it should be noted that the flowers have a rather odd, and not altogether agreeable odor.).

Plans for our annual spring show are well advanced. Anyone who would like to help with the show would be very welcomed; there is always a great need. It is a complicated business with all the logistical planning, setting things up, running the proceedings, and then taking it all down again. Our first speaker of the New Year is long time member Patrick van Adrichem. As many of you know he is an expert on *Phalaenopsis* and maintains a commercial nursery. He will have numerous lovely hybrids available for sale. *Phalaenopsis* hybrids are probably the most popular of all orchids. They have the distinct advantages of being happy in the conditions of the average home and staying in bloom for months at a time. The flowers are large and attractive.

For those interested in seeing how their own favourites compare in the world, there will be an AOS judging on January 13<sup>th</sup>. Since the recent setting out on our own as the Western Canada Judging Centre, we are now alternating with Vancouver as the site of the monthly judgings and so the next one on the 13th will be at the Swan Lake Nature Sanctuary in Victoria.

January 22<sup>nd</sup> Meeting: Patrick van Adrichem – "The Journey to growing better Orchids"



Patrick has been growing Orchids for nearly 30 years. He and his wife, Cathy, own Kingfisher Orchids, a well-known name in the orchid community. They specialize in mainly warm growing orchids such as Phalaenopsis and Dendrobiums. They always provide beautiful displays at orchid shows and Pat and Cathy have won over 20 American Orchid Society awards for Orchids.

Pat and Cathy have been breeding and cloning orchids for 25 years, and have many of their crosses registered with the RHS in England. They are currently breeding for red, yellow and art shade Phalaenopsis, as well as cloning selected species and hybrid plants.

- We will be asking for <u>volunteers</u> to sign up for the event (March 1-4) in key roles for set-up, take down, admissions, security, cashier, packers, registration table, ribbon judging, to name a few. We will begin the sign-up sheets at the January 22 meeting. You may notice some small changes from previous years to streamline our resources.
- As always, <u>trophy sponsors</u> will be needed for the show. A sign-up sheet will be passed around at the January meeting for members wishing to sponsor a particular Class at the show.

- We are accepting donations for a <u>group basket</u> to include special items such as chocolate, teas, chutneys, wine and other such treats. More information about the Silent Auction will be announced at our January Meeting.

And finally, we need your beautiful orchids to display!! Ingrid will be presenting valuable information during her talk "Preparing your Orchids for a Show" at our February meeting. In the meantime, here is a good reminder about plant preparation from a previous newsletter.

- Staking flower spikes or wobbly plants that lean over, cleaning leaves and checking for insect life. This year's theme is "Orchids in Nature" so keep this in mind in your preparation.
- Making sure that the plants aren't turned away from their regular light source. All the flowers on each inflorescence should look in the same direction. The stems may face in different directions, as long as the display is pleasing. Don't try to repot your plants just for the show you might damage the flowers.
- Washing pots and leaves thoroughly and removing all dead stems, old flower stalks, baby ferns or other weeds and brown leaves. Put an extra shine of the clean leaves by gently wiping the top part with milk.
- Cleaning the labels, checking that each plant has its correct name, including any award it may have won.
- Attaching a label with your name to the bottom of the pot and putting your name on the transport box. You want your plant back!

Thank you all for your time and energy as you help, once again, make the show a great event!

# **Society Information**

Meetings are held at the <u>Gordon Head United Church Hall, 4201 Tyndall Avenue</u>, Victoria, B.C. on the <u>fourth Monday of the month</u>. Members are encouraged to bring their orchids in bloom to display on the show table. They will be photographed and posted on our website.

Guest speakers are engaged for these meetings and often, speakers bring plants for sale. There is also a sale table where plants brought in by members may be purchased. There is often a pre-meeting, basic workshop from 7:00 - 7:30 p.m. Plant sales begin at 7:15 p.m. and the meeting runs from 7:30 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Membership fees are \$25.00 for individuals, \$35.00 for households. The Society membership year runs from September to September, but meetings are not held in July and August. Name tags are available for \$9.00, magnetized tags are \$11.00.

Coffee and tea are available for \$1.00 at the meeting and goodies are provided by members in rotation, based upon the initial letter of their last names. Goodies are requested from those with last names beginning with O, P, & R for the January meeting.

The Victoria Orchid Society Newsletter is published monthly, around the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month, excepting December, July and August. Newsletters will be sent by email to members with email access. Email addresses will be blind copied.
